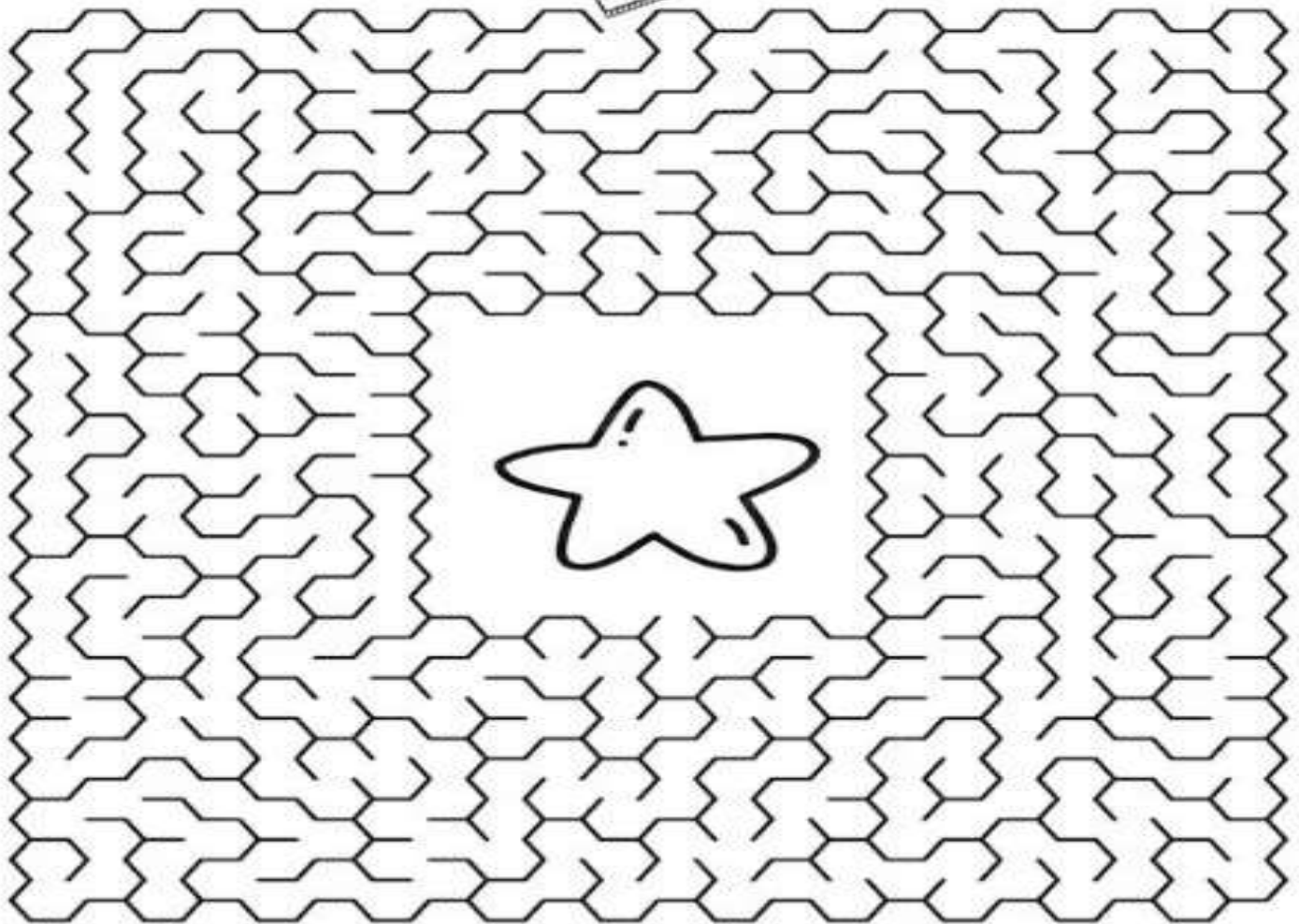

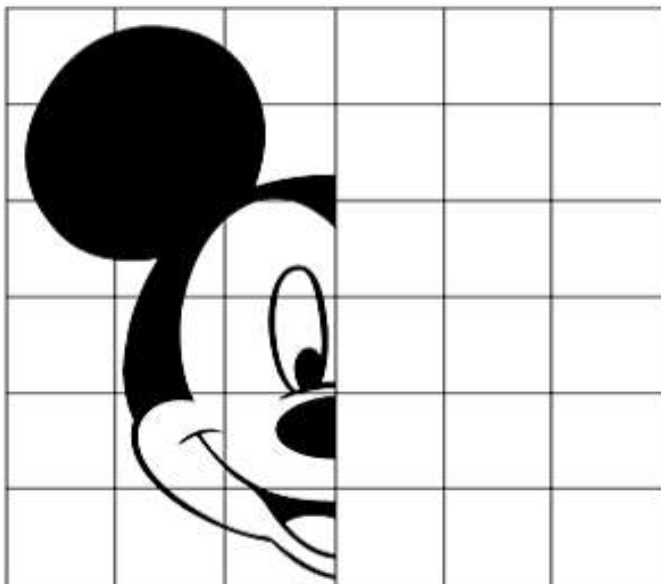

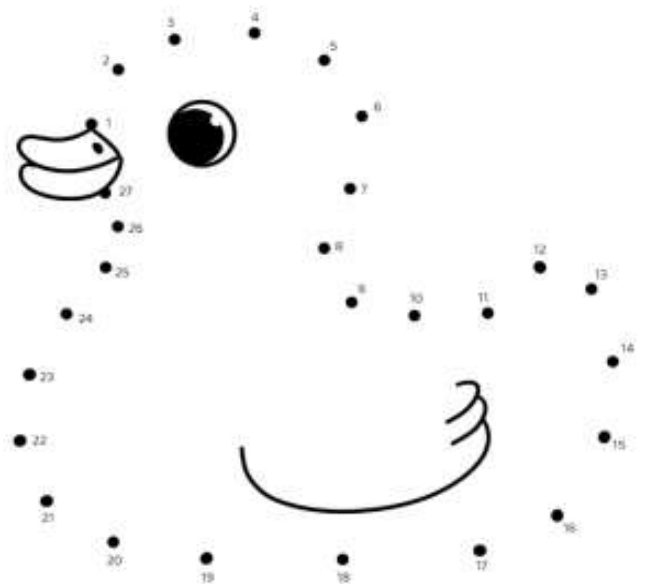

The North Lambton Community Health Centre

The North Lambton Community Health Centre is a community governed health centre serving identified priority populations in a defined catchment area. The Centre operates multiple sites in **Forest, Kettle & Stony Point, Watford, and Sarnia, Ontario**. Our interdisciplinary team provides primary health care, health promotion and community development services.

As part of the Afterschool Strategy, funded by the Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries, the North Lambton Community Health Centre, in partnership with Aamjiwnaang First Nation, requires the following contract positions from September 2024 until June 2025:

- (1) Program Leader – 37.5 hours/week**
- (4) Youth Leaders – up to 9 hours/week**

The Program Leaders and Youth Leaders will work closely together in planning, developing, implementing, and evaluating the Afterschool Strategy Program. This program is offered afterschool in the First Nation community of Aamjiwnaang. The focus of the program is to provide physical activity and healthy living education to school aged children and youth from grades 1-4 after school.

Seniors Prescription Drug Coverage

When a senior in Ontario turns 65, their medications are automatically covered by a program called the Ontario Drug Benefit Program. This program charges a deductible (Client pays for the first \$100 towards their medications every year starting on August 1) and a co-payment (up to \$6.11 per prescription)

If you have status, you do not have to pay the deductible or the co-payment. If you are charged a deductible or co-payment at the pharmacy, please provide them with your status card and those charges should be covered by the Non- Insured Health Benefits Program (Indigenous Services Canada). 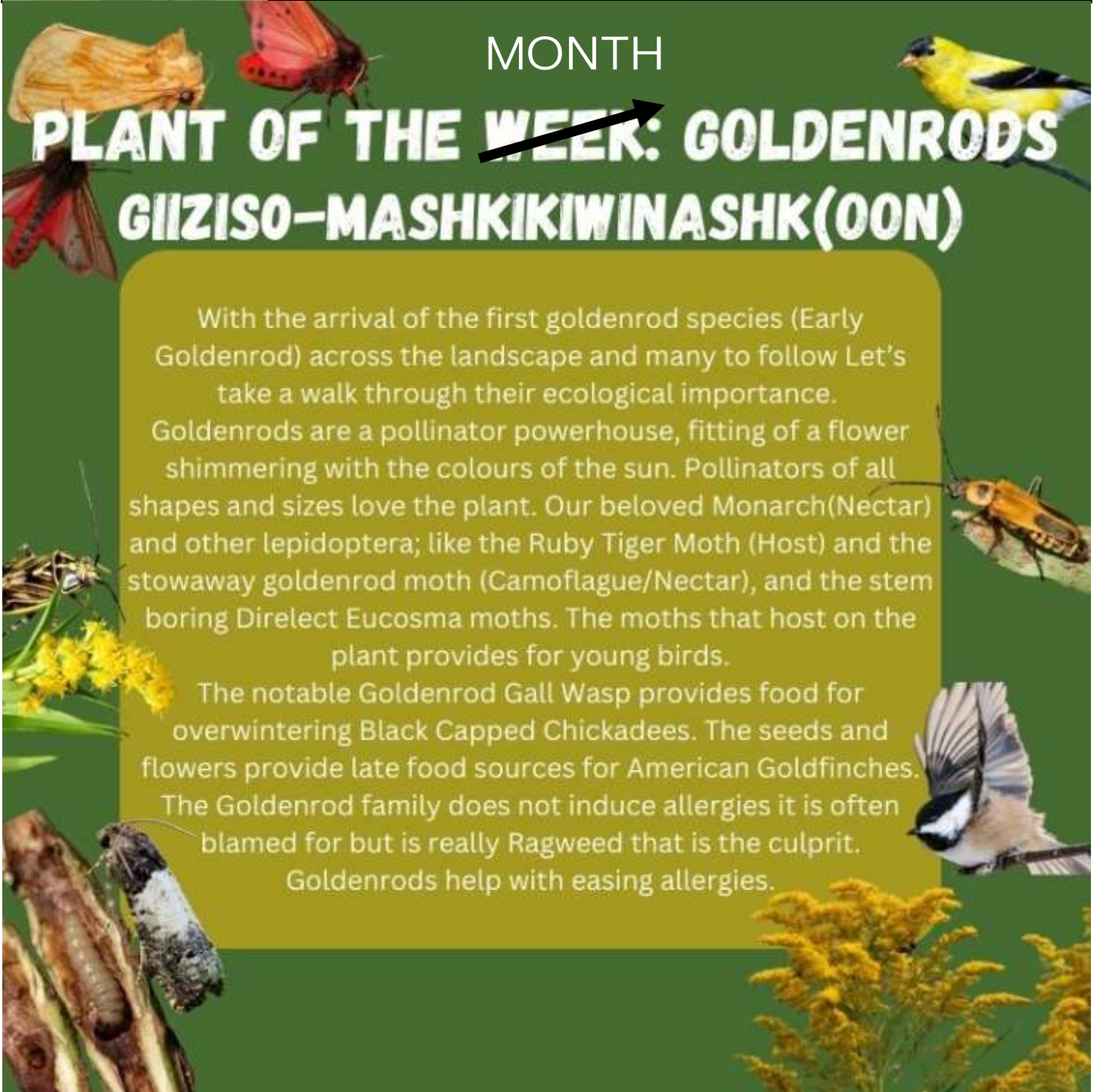

PLANT OF THE WEEK: GOLDENRODS
GIIZISO-MASHKIKIWINASHK(OON)

With the arrival of the first goldenrod species (Early Goldenrod) across the landscape and many to follow Let's take a walk through their ecological importance. Goldenrods are a pollinator powerhouse, fitting of a flower shimmering with the colours of the sun. Pollinators of all shapes and sizes love the plant. Our beloved Monarch(Nectar) and other lepidoptera; like the Ruby Tiger Moth (Host) and the stowaway goldenrod moth (Camouflage/Nectar), and the stem boring Direlect Eucosma moths. The moths that host on the plant provides for young birds.

The notable Goldenrod Gall Wasp provides food for overwintering Black Capped Chickadees. The seeds and flowers provide late food sources for American Goldfinches. The Goldenrod family does not induce allergies it is often blamed for but is really Ragweed that is the culprit. Goldenrods help with easing allergies.

The Non-Insured Health Benefits Program (NIHB) - (Indigenous Services Canada) is a National Program administered by Health Canada providing coverage for:

Dental, Drugs, Medical Supplies & Equipment, Medical Transportation, Vision Care, and Short-Term Crisis Intervention Mental Health Counselling.

Using you Benefits: When you present your status card to any health provider, as if they bill directly to NIHB before obtaining the service. Ensure the health care provider verifies that the product/treatment is an eligible benefit listed on NIHB

Be Aware: If you are asked to pay upfront, it can take 6-8 weeks to be reimbursed, and you may not get reimbursed if the benefit was not pre-approved. You may want to seek out a provider that does bill directly to NIHB. The Drug or product may be an exception benefit requiring the provider to call the Drug Exception Centre at 1-800-580-0950
