Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the electors of the Aamjiwnaang First Nation will be held at the Maawn Doosh Gumig Community Centre, 1972 Virgil Avenue, Sarnia, ON, N7T 7H5 on Friday the 6<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2024, beginning at 5:00 o'clock p.m. and lasting for at least three hours to conclude at 8:00 o'clock p.m., for the purpose of nominating candidates for the positions of chief and councillors on the Band Council of the said Band, for the next ensuing term. There are nine (9) Councillor positions and one (1) position for Chief available.

#### The North Lambton Community Health Centre

The North Lambton Community Health Centre is a community governed health centre serving identified priority populations in a defined catchment area. The Centre operates multiple sites in Forest, Kettle & Stony Point, Watford, and Sarnia, Ontario. Our interdisciplinary team provides primary health care, health promotion and community development services.

As part of the Afterschool Strategy, funded by the Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries, the North Lambton Community Health Centre, in partnership with Aamjiwnaang First Nation, requires the following contract positions from September 2024 until June 2025:

- (1) Program Leader 37.5 hours/week
- (4) Youth Leaders up to 9 hours/week

The Program Leaders and Youth Leaders will work closely together in planning, developing, implementing, and evaluating the Afterschool Strategy Program. This program is offered afterschool in the First Nation community of Aamjiwnaang. The focus of the program is to provide physical activity and healthy living education to school aged children and youth from grades 1-4 after school.

As many may have noticed, a 60'x 24' addition on the south side of the Community Center has already started. This addition will be used to store large items like tables and chairs. It will also be equipped with a garage door, that will allow those utilizing the kitchen to unload under a covered roof, near the kitchen instead of at the front door of the Community Centre.

#### Seniors Prescription Drug Coverage

When a senior in Ontario turns 65, their medications are automatically covered by a program called the Ontario Drug Benefit

Program. This program charges a <u>deductible</u> (Client pays for the first \$100 towards their medications every year starting on August 1) and a <u>co-payment</u> (up to \$6.11 per prescription)

If you have status, you do not have to pay the deductible or the copayment. If you are charged a deductible or co-payment at the pharmacy, please provide them with your status card and those charges should be covered by the Non- Insured Health Benefits Program (Indigenous Services Canada). If you end up paying out of pocket, please contact Peggy Rogers at the Health Centre 519-332-6770 ext. 320

Benefits Outside of Canada: You must purchase travel health insurance if you travel outside of Canada.
