Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the electors of the Aamjiwnaang First Nation will be held at the Maawn Doosh Gumig Community Centre, 1972 Virgil Avenue, Sarnia, ON, N7T 7H5 on Friday the 6th day of September, 2024, beginning at 5:00 o'clock p.m. and lasting for at least three hours to conclude at 8:00 o'clock p.m., for the purpose of nominating candidates for the positions of chief and councillors on the Band Council of the said Band, for the next ensuing term. There are nine (9) Councillor positions and one (1) position for Chief available.

The election will be held at the Maawn Doosh Gumig Community Centre, 1972 Virgil Avenue, Sarnia, ON, N7T 7H5 on Friday the 18th day of October, 2024.

Please note that any voter may nominate candidates by using a mail-in nomination form. All voters may nominate candidates for both Chief and Councillor positions. You can either deliver or mail-in a written nomination and a completed, signed and witnessed voter declaration form to the Electoral Officer before the time set for the nomination meeting **OR** you may nominate candidates orally at the nomination meeting. Mailed nominations not received by the Electoral Officer before the time set for nomination meeting are void. Also note that any voter may vote by mail-in ballot.

I look forward to sharing my ideas and working with you all on this exciting new journey. Thank you for welcoming me, and I can't wait to get started and meet everyone!





The North Lambton Community Health Centre

The North Lambton Community Health Centre is a community governed health centre serving identified priority populations in a defined catchment area. The Centre operates multiple sites in Forest, Kettle & Stony Point, Watford, and Sarnia, Ontario. Our interdisciplinary team provides primary health care, health promotion and community development services.

As part of the Afterschool Strategy, funded by the Ministry of Heritage, Sport, Tourism and Culture Industries, the North Lambton Community Health Centre, in partnership with Aamjiwnaang First Nation, requires the following contract positions from September 2024 until June 2025:

- (1) Program Leader 37.5 hours/week
- (4) Youth Leaders up to 9 hours/week

The Program Leaders and Youth Leaders will work closely together in planning, developing, implementing, and evaluating the Afterschool Strategy Program. This program is offered afterschool in the First Nation community of Aamjiwnaang. The focus of the program is to provide physical activity and healthy living education to school aged children and youth from grades 1-4 after school.

JOB DESCRIPTION COMMUNITY RESEARCH COORDINATOR

ABOUT US

The University of Toronto (UofT) has received approval from Chief and Council to include Aamjiwnaang in a study aimed at strengthening dental health care in the region. This project is built around community-based, participatory research in partnership with the University of Toronto's Indigenous Oral Health Group, which is a network of collaborative research teams, community partners and academics/researchers from across the country that have come together to address Indigenous oral health issues via research and advocacy.

This **Community Research Coordinator** position is part of a University of Toronto-based project on the impact of cannabis use on Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples' oral health. The study will take a longitudinal look at different risk factors in participants and will include different stages where participants will be followed-up and receive periodical dental examinations as well as provide saliva and urine samples.

ABOUT THE POSITION: DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The position that we are seeking to fill is that of a part-time (3 days per week, on average) Community Research Coordinator. The terms and conditions of employment will be governed by the collective agreement between the *University of Toronto and United Steelworkers, Local 1998*, applicable to casual employees. The person to take this position will be dynamically engaging with participants, the community research partners, and the Toronto-based research team. The position entails the following:

- Support community engagement activities, which can range from organizing meetings between the research team and the community partners.
- Act as a liaison between the research team and the community partners.
- Support knowledge mobilization activities (e.g., conduct radio interviews and lead talking circles) as the project progresses.
- Support the recruitment and retention of study participants. This includes contacting
 potential participants to book, confirm, change or cancel appointment dates in collaboration
 with the study's dental examiner/team.
- Arrange short notice or replacement participants when there are cancellations and notify the dental examiner/team.
- Collect and secure participant consent appropriately throughout the project. This also
 includes ensuring that the First Nations Principles of OCAP® are closely followed when
 working with First Nations populations.
- Provide participants with instructions for all phases of the research.
- Support participants with referrals for urgent treatment, if necessary.
- Support data collection activities (i.e., conduct interviews and administer survey questionnaires).
- Enter data in Excel or other software and ensure the accuracy of the data collected/entered.
- Organize the accommodations for the dental team during community visits. This includes, but is not limited to: setting up accommodations, transportation, booking venue(s).
- Provide reports as required and take part in the auditing process.
- Keep research participants informed of the progress of the study.
- Keep participant records confidential.







- Provide the dental examiner with support during their time in the community.
- Periodically manage biological samples (saliva and urine).
- Carry out other duties related to the study in the community as required.

ABOUT YOU

- Dynamic, responsible, and responsive in the capacities that are requested.
- A background in dental-related activities is preferred (dental assisting, dental hygiene, internationally trained dental professionals), but not a must.
- A preference will be given to individuals that have experience and familiarity working within Indigenous contexts. The ability to speak an Indigenous language is an asset.
- Previous experience in the organization and implementation of public health projects in community settings is also an asset.
- Computer skills and proficiency (including but not limited to Microsoft Word, Excel and Outlook).

Attention Aamjiwnaang Members:

Community Services would like to provide the following updates on the developments happening at the Community Centre and Bear Park.

As many may have noticed, a 60'x 24' addition on the south side of the Community Center has already started. This addition will be used to store large items like tables and chairs. It will also be equipped with a garage door, that will allow those utilizing the kitchen to unload under a covered roof, near the kitchen instead of at the front door of the Community Centre.

FineArtscape Designs has begun work on landscaping changes and upgrades. This will improve the appearance of the exterior of the Community Centre and require less maintenance and upkeep throughout the year.

Lastly, we will be replacing the bridge that goes over Talford Creek to the Wahboose Circle area as it has deteriorated the last couple of years.



Seniors Prescription Drug Coverage

When a senior in Ontario turns 65, their medications are automatically covered by a program called the Ontario Drug Benefit Program. This program charges a

<u>deductible</u> (Client pays for the first \$100 towards their medications every year starting on August 1) and a <u>co-payment</u> (up to \$6.11 per prescription)

If you have status, you do not have to pay the deductible or the copayment. If you are charged a deductible or co-payment at the pharmacy, please provide them with your status card and those charges should be covered by the Non- Insured Health Benefits Program (Indigenous Services Canada). If you end up paying out of pocket, please contact Peggy Rogers at the Health Centre 519-332-6770 ext. 320

We carry asemaa/tobacco to offer at flowing waters, sacred sites, and to honor our relatives in Creation seen along roads or trails. While carrying Nibi, we pray or sing, focusing on meaningful communication. The walk is led by Grandmothers who offer guidance and support.






