

#### Seniors Prescription Drug Coverage

When a senior in Ontario turns 65, their medications are automatically covered by a program called the Ontario Drug Benefit Program. This program charges a <u>deductible</u> (Client pays for the first \$100 towards their medications every year starting on August 1) and a <u>co-payment</u> (up to \$6.11 per prescription)

If you have status, you do not have to pay the deductible or the co-payment. If you are charged a deductible or co-payment at the pharmacy, please provide them with your status card and those charges should be covered by the Non- Insured Health Benefits Program (Indigenous Services Canada). If you end up paying out of pocket, please contact Peggy Rogers at the Health Centre 519-332-6770 ext. 320

#### Purpose of the Position

To maintain and ensure a high standard of cleanliness for Aamjiwnaang First Nation in all public and staff areas in our buildings as part of a team. Team Cleaners will clean the following buildings, Seniors Building, Annex, Resource Centre, Public Works, Fieldhouse, Administration (Band Office), Education Centre/Portable, Social Services Building and the Health Centre.

#### Responsibilities

Within Aamjiwnaang we have Team Cleaning specialists that are independently deployed in a systematic method and perform assigned cleaning tasks in designated areas based on allotted time. By focusing primarily on one type of work, each Team Cleaning member becomes more skilled, more effective at the job, and more knowledgeable about proper safety procedures for that job. Each specialist role involves specific tools and tasks, as well as performance standards.

There are four distinct positions within our Team Cleaning (all of Team Cleaners will be trained on each specialized area):

#### Light-duty Specialist

- Empties the trash and recycling bins
- Dusts and disinfects all horizontal surfaces
- Cleans telephones
- · Spot cleans horizontal and vertical surfaces as needed
- Picks up paper clips, paper and pencils from floor
- Spot-cleans door glass
- Positions trash in a strategic location for the Utility Specialist to pick up and take to the dumpster

#### Vacuum Specialist

- Vacuums all areas
- Checks to see the trash was emptied
- Removes crumbs, ashes or other spills on furniture
- Repositions all furniture correctly
- Turns out lights upon completion of the room and secure area as required

#### Restroom Specialist

- Empties the garbage
- · Cleans/disinfects and sanitizes fixtures and mirrors
- Spot-cleans and disinfects partitions and doors
- Refills toilet tissue and refills all other dispensers
- Sweeps and mops tile floors
- Checks all fixtures and makes a note of any damage or burned-out light bulbs to the Team Leader

#### Utility Specialist

- Hauls the trash out of the building that has been accumulated by the other specialists
- · Cleans the brass, blinds and carpet where needed
- · Mopping of floors
- Does any damp or wet mopping
- · Handles light maintenance and other specialty services

· Other duties as assigned

Home Winterproofing Program (HWP) from Enbridge Gas:



Energy Affordability Program (EAP) from Save on Energy:

#### Get Booked

Based on your screening, we'll book a full assessment, an audit. Audits are reserved for homes that have ample insulation deficiencies.

#### Home Assessment / Audit

An assessor will visit your home and install basic upgrades + collect Information to determine eligibility for appliance / insulation upgrades.

#### Installs (if eligible)

Our team will use the data gathered on site to determine eligibility for appliance and/or insulation upgrades. If you qualify, our install team will book you (Appliances and insulation are upgraded in separate visits).

#### Final Assessment

- To find out if you qualify for the program, this form will ask questions about government benefits you may receive, your home's characteristics, and your income. Qualifying means you are eligible for an in-home visit. During our visit, we will:
  - A. Install basic upgrades as necessary these are things like efficient lighting, water efficient showerheads, water efficient tap aerators, advanced power bars, pipe/tank insulation for hot water tanks, and a carbon monoxide alarm.
  - B. Record the age and efficiency of the following: thermostats, fridges, freezers, dehumidifiers, and A/C.
  - C. If eligible (based on the age of your home and insulation details) we will record your home's actual insulation levels (basement, exterior walls, attic) as well as its air tightness and air leak locations.
- After our visit, we will use the assessor's notes and photographs to determine if you qualify for appliance upgrades and winterproofing upgrades (air sealing your home and insulating basements, exterior walls, and/or attics). You can expect a response within 10 business days of the visit.

#### Books and Supplies Reimbursment

At the beginning of each college semester every student is given \$400.00. That is to be used towards books, supplies, program tests (CPR/First Aid., TB tests., CPIC., uniforms, shoes, tools etc). Please keep all original receipts and once you have purchased all program supplies and it is OVER \$400, than you may request a reimbursement. For example, if your total receipt amount is \$550.00 than you will receive a reimbursement of \$150.00.

The same process is considered for university students. However, university students receive \$800.00 at the beginning of the Fall term and that is for the Fall/Winter terms combined.


#### Email/Phone Number

Please be sure that we have your current email and cell number on file. Emails are sent out on a regular basis to update students on any program changes, bursary opportunities, changes in policy and reminders to update marks/midterms etc. into your Outcomes portal in Dadavan.

#### Withdrawing From Your Program at School

If you withdraw, drop-out, need to drop classes, or otherwise decide not to attend school, please let us know so we can support you through the process.

We understand that life is challenging, and we encourage you to reach out and discuss with the post-secondary counsellor and together a plan will be put in place so that you can return at a better time.



#### Application Process

With our newly implemented application system, students who are Priority 4, 5, 6, and 7 are required to apply for every requested term of funding through the Outcomes Student Information System. Those who are a Priority 1 and 3 do not need to reapply UNLESS they are applying for a different program than what they originally applied for.

For returning students, use the link above, click on "Student Page Login", and enter the email used with the initial application to sign in or request a password which is sent to the email.

#### **Application Deadlines:**

Fall - May 1 Winter - October 1 Spring/Summer - March 1

Unfortunately, the system does not send a submission confirmation email, but a box does pop up when the application is submitted confirming "application submitted." If, you have any questions, please contact Aamjiwnaang Post-Secondary to confirm receipt of your application.

#### Application Approvals

The application review and approval process typically take 30 days from the application deadlines. Students will receive an email correspondence with an update on their application. If accepted into the program, they will receive a "Conditional Letter of Acceptance" which outlines required documentation submission.

#### Required Documentation

These are the required documents that students need to upload to the Outcomes Student Information System under "Documents."

- · Acceptance letter/verification of enrolment/tuition statement
- High school diploma or transcript
- · Direct deposit form/void cheque
- Release of Information form
- Student Contract form
- Career Action Plan
- Previous term final grades (for returning students)

#### What happens next?

Once all required documentation has been received, a sponsorship letter will be sent to the Post-Secondary institution which covers the non-refundable fee and tuition fees. The institutions will invoice the tuition fees to the Post-Secondary Department and Aamjiwnaang First Nation will directly pay the schools.

Students who are staying in residence must also submit residence acceptance and a sponsorship letter will be sent to the institution. The student will need to speak with Aamjiwnaang Post-Secondary to discuss sponsorship for residence fees. The agreed upon amount to be paid for residence fees are invoiced to the Post-Secondary Department and will be paid directly to the school. Residence costs over the set amount will be the responsibility of the student.


A final letter outlining details of student funding will be sent to students via email. (Eligibility Letter)

Students should expect deposits on the second last business day of the month. Please submit any banking changes at least 10 days prior to the next deposit date.
