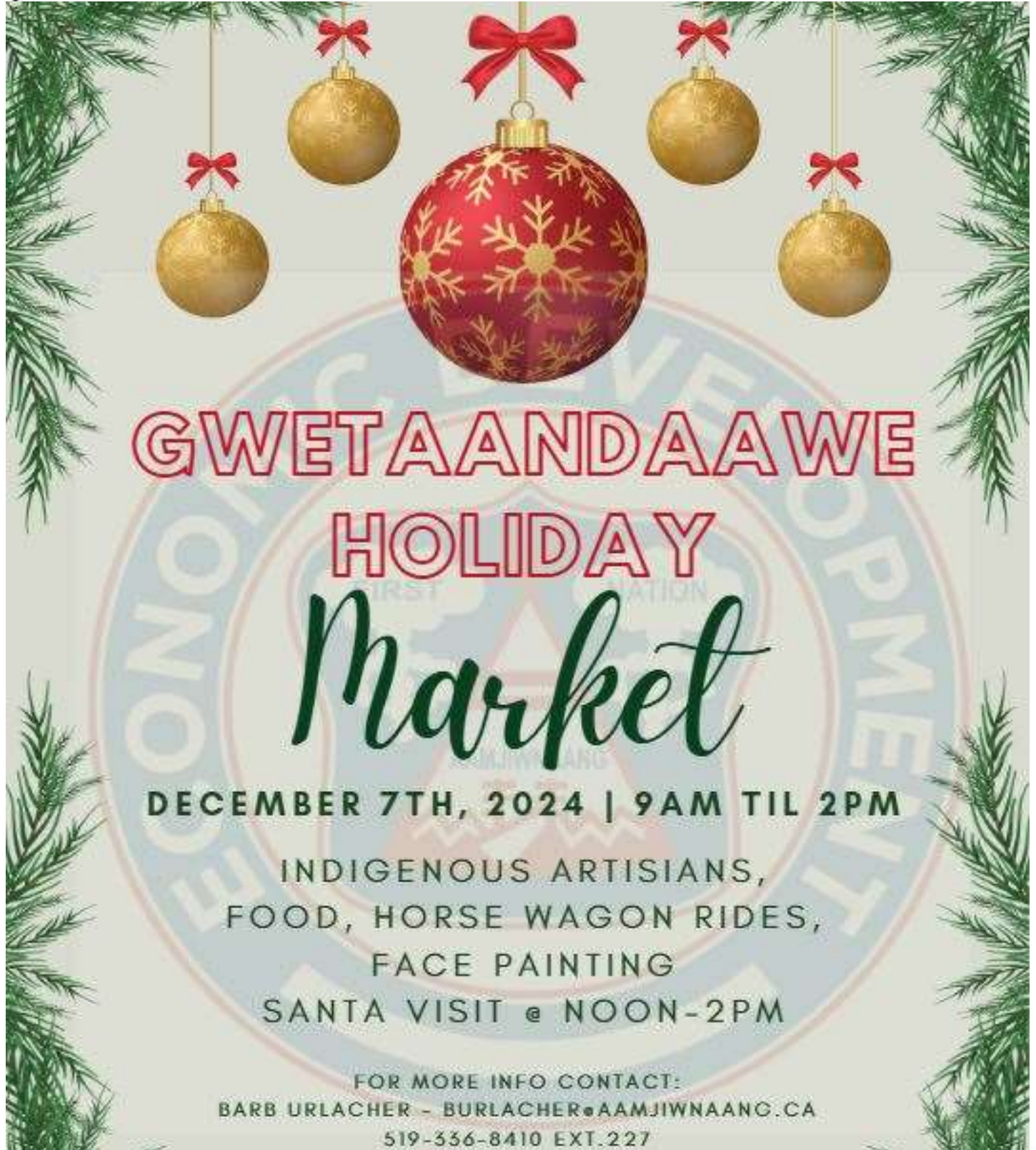

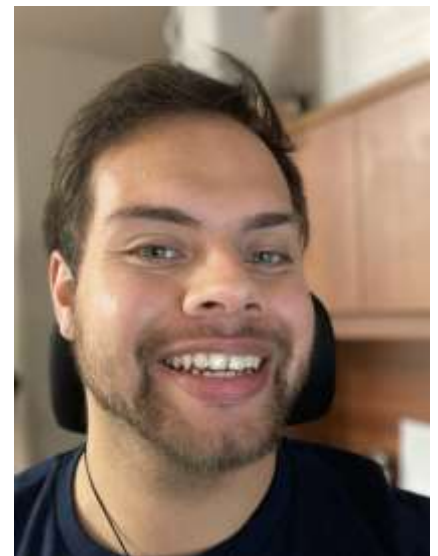

- **To ensure payment on December 6, all changes must be received by Friday, November 15.**
- Payments for minor children will be made as follows:
  - Payments for minor children will be made to the biological custodial parent, provided that person is an Aamjiwnaang Band member.
  - Payments for minor children whose biological custodial parent is not an Aamjiwnaang Band member will be held in trust until the child attains legal age.
  - Non-biological custodial caregivers receiving distribution shares for minors prior to November 30, 2024 will continue to receive payments until the minor child(ren) turns 18.
  - If requested, proper documentation must be provided.
- **US cheques will be available for in-person pickup. Any US cheques not picked up on December 6 will be mailed the following week.**
- Calculation for distribution is based on a percentage of last year's own source revenue, such as wind farms and pipelines, that was not committed to operating Band programs.

### Purpose of the Position

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To maintain and ensure a high standard of cleanliness for Aamjiwnaang First Nation in all public and staff areas in our buildings as part of a team. Team Cleaners will clean the following buildings, Seniors Building, Annex, Resource Centre, Public Works, Fieldhouse, Administration (Band Office), Education Centre/Portable, Social Services Building and the Health Centre.

### Responsibilities

---

Within Aamjiwnaang we have Team Cleaning specialists that are independently deployed in a systematic method and perform assigned cleaning tasks in designated areas based on allotted time. By focusing primarily on one type of work, each Team Cleaning member becomes more skilled, more effective at the job, and more knowledgeable about proper safety procedures for that job. Each specialist role involves specific tools and tasks, as well as performance standards.

There are four distinct positions within our Team Cleaning (all of Team Cleaners will be trained on each specialized area):

#### Light-duty Specialist

- Empties the trash and recycling bins
- Dusts and disinfects all horizontal surfaces
- Cleans telephones
- Spot cleans horizontal and vertical surfaces as needed
- Picks up paper clips, paper and pencils from floor
- Spot-cleans door glass
- Positions trash in a strategic location for the Utility Specialist to pick up and take to the dumpster

#### Vacuum Specialist

- Vacuums all areas
- Checks to see the trash was emptied
- Removes crumbs, ashes or other spills on furniture
- Repositions all furniture correctly
- Turns out lights upon completion of the room and secure area as required

#### Restroom Specialist

- Empties the garbage
- Cleans/disinfects and sanitizes fixtures and mirrors
- Spot-cleans and disinfects partitions and doors
- Refills toilet tissue and refills all other dispensers
- Sweeps and mops tile floors

- Checks all fixtures and makes a note of any damage or burned-out light bulbs to the Team Leader

### Utility Specialist

- Hauls the trash out of the building that has been accumulated by the other specialists
- Cleans the brass, blinds and carpet where needed
- Mopping of floors
- Does any damp or wet mopping
- Handles light maintenance and other specialty services

### Other:

- Other duties as assigned

### Minimum Requirements

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- High School Diploma or equivalent required
- Criminal Check (no older than 12 months)
- Extensive experience in all aspects of general cleaning, including window treatments
- Strong experience in the use of floor polishing and other cleaning equipment
- Current G Class Driver's License and reliable transportation
- Training in the awareness of cleaning products, their use and ability to use

- Ability to read and understand labels and instructions, particularly on the use and application of cleaning chemicals and products (Material Safety Data Sheets)
- Ability to work cohesively, efficiently and effectively in a team environment, with consideration, respect, honesty integrity and accountability
- Ability to respond appropriately in a team environment and show sensitivity and initiative, by encouraging and supporting other team members
- Good verbal communication and public relation skills
- Good organizational skills
- Ability to work unsupervised
- Good time management skills and working to deadlines
- Proficient in the ability to operate cleaning equipment
- Ability to work flexible working hours and or public holidays

### Position Summary

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The Early Childhood Educator will work with the teacher in providing a quality, caring and supportive Kindergarten program at AKG. The ECE will be responsible for supporting the teacher in the academic, social-emotional growth and development of all students; create play-based learning opportunities; develops partnerships with parents and caregivers. This position reports to the Manager of Education.

### Responsibilities

---

1. Plan, carry out, and assess developmentally appropriate activities
  - In collaboration with the classroom teacher, provide a daily balance of activities
  - Follow the daily schedule of activities, routines, and transition times
  - Organize space, equipment and materials before activities
  - Use a variety of teaching techniques including modelling, observing, questioning, demonstrating, and reinforcing
  - Provide opportunity for student inclusion with play experience
  - Plan and carry out activities that encourage problem solving
  - Participate in annual planning and professional development
2. Individualize the curriculum
  - Work as a team to observe how children use materials and interact with each other and adults
  - Use observations to expand play and plan activities that recognize individual difference
  - Initiate referrals or additional services for students in collaboration with classroom teacher
3. Ensure guidance of student behaviour that encourages positive self-concept
  - Set reasonable behaviour expectations consistent with AKG policies
  - Provide positive guidelines such as redirecting, positive language, and positive reinforcement
  - Immediately address problem behaviour without labelling the student
  - Follow behaviour guidance consistent with accepted practice in the field of ECE

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- Ability to build trust and positive relationships with students and families
- Act as a role model of appropriate behaviour
- Ability to work cooperatively as a member of the AKG team, facilitating a team environment through personal behaviour, work contributions and the sharing of expertise and knowledge

- Ability to be energetic, resilient and maintains a sense of humour
- Effective interpersonal skills under all types of conditions, exhibiting a supportive, positive approach

### Scope of the Position

---

The Manager of Development is responsible for the leadership of economic development, lands and environment, pipelines, and corporate initiatives undertaken on behalf of the Aamjiwnaang First Nation (AFN). This role is responsible for improving AFN's capacity for sustainable economic growth, seeking economic diversification, and working collaboratively with both internal and external groups. The Manager of Development focuses on opportunities and development priorities to grow the economy and support AFN's economic priorities. This role is also responsible for the management of oversight of the Lands Office and Land Registry related to reserve lands. The role provides supervision, oversight, and direction to the Development department staff, Environment department staff, Lands department staff and contributes to the strategic and business planning for AFN.

### Responsibilities

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#### 1. Development Leadership

- Identify, lead, and manage community and economic development planning and initiatives; identifying and fostering community economic development opportunities; securing funding for economic development activities and programs; assisting local organizations, businesses, and individuals, with establishing economic development plans and projects
- Oversee the conservation and protection of the air, land, and water environments initiatives for AFN
- Engage in and develop the Strategic Business Plan for AFN based on engagement and input from members of the community, public, Chief and Council
- Recommend strategic initiatives, and identify opportunities for further economic development
- Accountable for providing strategic and operational leadership on all aspects of development
- Promote and champion the AFN community to expand economic development opportunities
- Provide expert input and advice on short- and long-term economic development strategies and business plans that align with the AFN's stated goals, objectives, and vision
- Develop the annual work plan, report and budget based on identified priorities and requirements of partner funding entities
- Identify and provide oversight and management of applications for grants and funding opportunities or partnerships available to further the economic development goals / initiatives of the community
- Remain informed of Provincial and Federal initiatives and communicate this information to Chief, Committee, Council, and program staff as needed
- Build alliances and partnerships with strategic external stakeholders including government representatives, organizations, and funders to advance AFN's economic goals and objectives
- Establish and maintain strong interpersonal relationships internally and with external stakeholders by using effective negotiating skills to reconcile differences, influence outcomes and bring people together for a shared purpose
- Liaise with other departments and various internal services to ensure that a cooperative and integrated level of service is provided

- Manage and plan development projects, engaging with a variety of industrial and commercial enterprises, community and business associations, and government agencies
- Oversight of corporations assigned to the Corporation Manager, ensuring planning, development, coordination, and implementation satisfies shareholders and tenants
- Ensure that corporations are preserved and increase the value and integrity of the properties and to meet the financial objectives of the board of directors and shareholders
- Identify, review, and assign commercial or industrial development proposals, providing strategic advice on procedures and approval requirements
- Ensure social and economic profiles of AFN urban and rural areas are updated and accurate to encourage investment and development in the community
- Utilize data, metrics, and research to make sound, well-informed, and objective decisions
- Conduct frequent research and analysis

## 2. People Management

- Provide leadership and direction to the Development department, Environment department and Lands department
- Supervise and support direct reports to ensure and foster wellbeing in a cooperative working environment
- Direct staff in accordance with policies, procedures, and systems in place, ensuring that staff conduct themselves in a professional manner in dealing with Aamjiwnaang Band members, staff, and the public
- Provide guidance, coaching, support, and training and development opportunities while engaging direct reports in goal setting and performance evaluation
- Manage all aspects of scheduling, including time off requests and ensuring adequate staffing coverage
- Work closely with Human Resources to manage hiring, discipline, or termination of direct reports
- Oversee new hires and onboarding process

## 3. Health and Safety Compliance

- Ensure workplace health and safety by identifying prevention opportunities, ensuring staff are trained in incident reporting systems, investigating potential risk and accidents, and applying timely corrective measures
- Maintain awareness of relevant legislation, policies, and procedures
- Adhere to policies of Aamjiwnaang First Nation, along with relevant economic development, reserve lands, employment, and other legislative requirements

## 4. Finance and Administration

- Oversee Full Cycle financial management to ensure financial accountability and the efficient utilization of all health resources
- Manage the departmental budget, including identifying new opportunities for revenue and approving spending requests
- (In Partnership with) Development of funding proposals, including planning, writing, and implementation
- Complete reporting related to budget and funding obligations, including financial, statistical, and qualitative



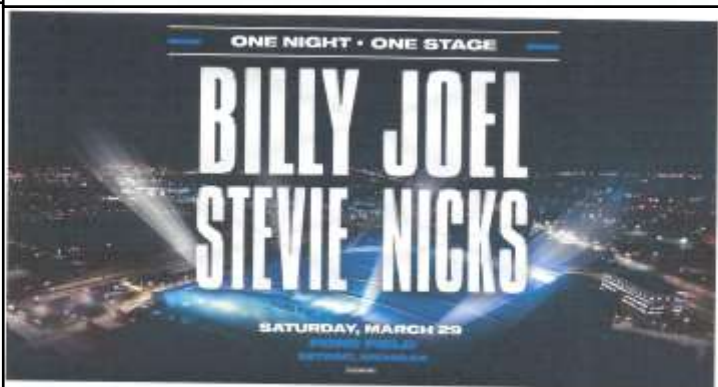
